Great and Little Broughton Parish Council

The Council recently completed installation of the new bench at the north end of the Holme, which was donated by a resident. We plan to re-grass the area and complement it with some native planting.



North Yorks Council were updating the Local Plan and the call for sites has ended. The sites submitted are on the PC website. <https://greatbroughton.org.uk/update-north-yorkshire-local-plan>

The Council met at an additional meeting in August to discuss the proposed Traffic Regulation Order from NYC for 'No waiting at any time' (Double yellow lines) restriction on the High Street, Lowcross Drive and The Dorkings. Despite standard advertising, no residents attended, but their earlier comments were considered. The Parish Council agreed that it did not support the proposed TRO because it did not address the wider traffic and parking challenges in the village.

A presentation was given by North Yorkshire Council and Karbon Homes to discuss how they evidenced affordable housing needs in the Parish including a resident's survey.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is on 14th September at 7pm.

Rowland Holmes-Smith 18/06/54 – 21/05/26

Rowland came to live in Kirkby with his family when he was six. The family bought the Grange, then derelict, as a project. He was sent to the Leys in Cambridge, where he spent five miserable years. The saving grace was the architecture and contact with Jim Ede, curator of the Tate, who lived at “Kettle’s Yard”.

Time in Venice, followed by Bristol University, expanded his passion for architecture. Working in London, Rowland found it hard to live comfortably on a trainee architect’s salary and, when his father became ill, returned North East to help. A keen skier, he arranged a holiday with a childhood friend using their joint address books, leading to him meeting Jane, whom he married.

Through the RIBA, Rowland met Chris Potter, a young architect. After meetings they ate pasta and drank red wine in Denhoffers wine bar in Middlesbrough, deciding to set up a practice together. They worked from Chris’ bedroom on South Parade in Northallerton, with a photocopier next to the bed! Daughters Sophie and Cressida were born as the business was being built.

Rowland was committed to the embryonic P+HS, burning the midnight oil to find the best solution to a problem. Before computer aided design, heaps of scrunched up paper covered the floor as he searched for the perfect house type or road layout. The practice grew into the nationally respected business it is today, with studios in Stokesley, Leeds, Newcastle and Manchester, employing around 120 people.

Together with Jane, Rowland built and renovated family homes, starting with Dundale Cottage in The Holme; then Holme Mead; renovating their house in Great Ayton and updating Westwood Farm. His final project was Hill Yard in Kirkby, a testament to his creativity and determination.

At home Rowland put his creativity to work, building stables from scaffolding poles and learning to horse ride aged 40 to keep up with his daughters. He was also a keen sailor and skier, and enjoyed organising parties and holidays.

Once retired, he threw himself into supporting his children and grandchildren with the same energy he brought to work. In spite of his illness, he remained active at home and while visiting family, even building six flat pack chairs two days before he died.
