

It's been all go here at Kirkby and Great Broughton Primary School. We have just celebrated interfaith week where we had Kirtida from the Hindu temple in Newcastle and Sohail from the Islamic Diversity Society, it was very interesting, and the children learned a lot about these faiths. One child said "It was very educating, yet exciting and helped us with our RE."

Reception have been celebrating Diwali, the festival of light. They have also made a poppy wreath together and leaned about Remembrance Day. For Children in Need, they have enjoyed decorating biscuits!

Year 1 have been looking at how animals survive, grow and stay healthy. They have been learning about the gunpowder plot and bonfire night too.

Davis Storry's son Richard has sent a long interesting Eulogy for his father David from which I have taken brief notes.

David Henry Storry born 12th May 1933, in Stockton on Tees.

He was most upset at being born in Stockton and not Yorkshire as this meant he could not play cricket for Yorkshire. He was a tall thin gentleman with a very distinctive laugh. I would like to summarise his life with the 3 'F's!

Fast cars! He always liked driving with fast cars, but his style was understated cars, nothing shouty or loud. Trying to be understated & stealthy at 100mph in the outside lane, was always going to be a tough ask!!

Fast boats! In 1958 He became Tees rowing club captain, a post he held for 4 years. Sculler Kat Copland who was selected to represent GB at the 2012 London Olympics in the lightweight women's double sculls was supported by David in her early years at the Tees Rowing Club. For recompense Kat invited David to the Dorney Lake, Olympic Event. He subsequently had many fast sailing and motor boats.

Fine wine! He developed his own wine knowledge and collection whilst undertaking professional valuations and twice yearly wine auctions. He travelled and bought directly from famous French vineyards and built wine cellars in several homes he owned.

It is safe to say that throughout his life he had many amazing experiences both professionally and socially. A life very well lived.
